

Eucharist and Confession

For the last several weeks, we have thought and prayed about the greatest gift we have been given, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is such a tremendous gift! How do we prepare for it? Michael Brown has much to say. One very important gift is the presence of confession in our lives. He writes: "It is through the radiance, the fire of Jesus, that our sins are burned away. That is why so many envision fire falling from the sky. The Lord purifies with heavenly flames that issue from his heart. They come from the furnace of his love. Our evil is evaporated in the Presence of Christ and is especially dispelled through Con-

"Confession prepares the way for the Eucharist and breaks the bonds of Satan. In verbally admitting our faults, we are declaring a humility that immediately chases away Satan. He cannot stand to be in our midst. He is the prince of pride. He cannot bear to stand in the presence of humility. He is powerless when a person is humble. He has no legal right to hold terrain. When we confess sins we are renouncing sins, which means we are renouncing the devil. When we renounce the devil in the Name of Jesus, he has no choice but to leave. His chains are broken. His hold on our minds and hearts is lessened or expelled altogether.

"During Holy Communion, demonic infestations are often chased from our very bodies or from around our family and friends. The stronger the confession, the more demonic resistance is cleared. The more demons that are expelled, the more peace we have. That is why before receiving Holy Communion, we should pray to the Holy Spirit to reveal any hidden faults we have never acknowledged and then take these to the confessional. A good time for such soul searching is during Adoration or on our knees before the Blessed Sacrament. We should ask the Holy Spirit to allow us expiation of the slightest sins. Go back to Scripture and note the many things that are listed by St. Paul as infractions, things we don't usually take to be of much consequence. Jealousy. Outbursts of anger. Selfishness. They are listed for us in Galatians 5:19-21 along with lewd conduct. After we remember all of our past transgressions and after we pray to heal all those we have hurt, we must maintain vigilance against repeating them. Confession should be a practice to keep ourselves pure because when we are pure, when Christ has wiped the slate clean of those many sins. Holy Communion and Adoration become even more potent. They take on a special radiance. They sweep to the very bottom of existence and purge faults that will otherwise cause a long purgatory.

"There is nothing more enjoyable than the experience of being spiritually clean. Nor is there anything more important for a soul's destiny. At least once a year, during Lent, we should prepare for a special confession and search for hidden faults we did not realize during the year. When we finally recognize that we have been doing something offensive to God, we confess and are given a new inner peace. That peace comes through liberation from past bondages. Holy Communion becomes a powerful tool of deliverance. It's like the Lord snipping a rope that had been tying up part of us. There is a feeling of strength and cleanliness. There is liberation. Jesus said, 'If you live according to my teaching, you are truly my disciples. Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free."



Participant Testimony: Atheist professor, Dr. Gloria Sampson, returns to the Church after 52 years.

The community she found through Discovering Christ helped answer many of the questions she had about the Catholic faith. "It was the availability of people to ask questions informally, not having to go directly to a priest with what seemed to me to be really stupid and dumb questions. They were there, they could answer them, they could bring forth things that I hadn't even thought about."

At the end of the series, there was an invitation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. She went and when she walked out of the confessional "felt free, felt ready to fly." She also returned to the Eucharist. She shared, "When I received the Eucharist for the first time after 52 years . . . ! had to control myself to keep from weeping out of happiness." Now I actually feel an urge to evangelize." I tell my story in the hope that maybe it will help someone else come back to the Church. God is within us and He comes through us so that we can give to others."
