# Following Jesus

"...whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many..." (Matt 26:26-28).

To be a Christian is to be a follower of Jesus Christ. As his disciples, we are to learn from him and to follow his example of how to live. We are, therefore, called to be of service. Just as God sent his Son into the world with a mission, so also each one of us has a mission, a purpose in life. This mission is our vocation. It doesn't matter if we are young or old, lay or ordained, single or married. Each one of us has a mission, a job God created us to do. God created you in a specific time and a specific place with a set of gifts and talents to accomplish a specific mission. No one else can do it for you. Only you! This vocation you have has many responsibilities, but it also has its rewards. One is the wholesome feeling of self-worth that should be yours. Since you are important to God, you are indeed a very important person! Others may not rate you as such. Others may not see you as gifted and blessed. They may see you as just average. Your job may be relatively humble. You may be tempted to feel inferior from time to time. Yet remember that money, position, popularity---all these measures the world uses to measure success--- are nothing to God. If you are seeking to do his will, then every least action you do has everlasting value. No matter how the world sees you, every breath you draw is precious to God.

Because you were created by God out of great love and given a mission, a purpose in his plan, you are very important to God. In a human sense...God needs you. Our view of human life is sacred. **Every** human life. It is not pride. It is not vanity. Pride is declaring my independence from God and proclaiming that I am responsible for my own achievements. Vanity is a stupid preoccupation on God's lesser, natural gifts of looks or talents. It is not humility to pretend that we are of little importance, or that life is meaningless, or that I would not matter if I never existed. It would be belittling God's wisdom and goodness. Yes, without God we can do nothing. It is just as true that God's love has made us great. He has raised us up, given us a share in his divine life and an important role in life. Such is the greatness of God's endless love.

Your mission, your vocation, has another benefit. It is freedom from serious worry. If you believe that God really loves you (He does!) and that He wants what is best for you (He does!) and that He is all powerful (He is!) then you cannot worry very much or for very long. God already knows what is best and is able to accomplish anything. As St. Paul wrote, "If God is for us, who can stand against us?" So you cannot lose as long as you put your faith in God and try to do your best with the knowledge and the gifts God has given to you.
