Indulgences

During the month of November, our Church invites us to pray more insistently and to offer our sufferings for the souls in purgatory. Pope John Paul II encouraged us to "feel bound by charity to offer those brothers and sisters who have experienced the fragility proper to human existence the help of our vigilant prayer. May whatever residue of human weakness still remaining in them to delay their happy encounter with God be definitively wiped out."

To enter into eternal life, it is necessary that we are purified of all sin. Does anybody remember in our younger days coming in from working outside and just plopping down at the dinner table? I do! Right away Mom would order us to go and get washed up first. So it is with purgatory. It is getting washed up before entering into the heavenly banquet with God. Some Christians argue against purgatory. But it is in the Scriptures and it makes sense. And even if we were forgiven just before dying, we may still have some evil thoughts rooted in our souls at death. Or, if we have not been to confession, we may still have some venial sins on our souls. Or we may have a lack of love in dealing with our Lord which will defer our union with Him. How many times have we done a good deed reluctantly because of anger or even just "I don't want to do it now" getting in the way? All this needs to be purified. Purgatory, part of the infinite love of God for us, gives this to us after our death.

The infinite value of the Mass makes it a very important prayer to offer to God. Remember reading about Mass intentions in the bulletin? It is an offering made by the parish asking for the Mass to be offered for a particular person. Other prayers, like the Rosary, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, other prayers, our work, the sufferings in this life as well as the indulgences we merit for others are all helpful in getting purified for heaven.

Indulgences are either plenary or partial. For a plenary indulgence, the wiping away of all sins, we are to 1) have the intention of gaining the plenary indulgence; 2) receive the Sacrament of Penance several days before or after the action of the indulgence; 3) receive Holy Communion within several days (it's best if on the same day); 4) pray 6 Our Father, 6 Hail Mary, and 6 Glory Be for the intention of our Pope; 5) perform the act of indulgence; and 6) be free from all attachment to venial sin. This last item can be difficult. If we still have an attachment to venial sin, even while we struggle to get rid of it, then we receive a partial indulgence. How much of a partial indulgence we leave up to God, our loving Father.

Indulgenced actions are simple. Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament for an hour, praying the Way of the Cross in church, a visit to a church on the Feast Day of All Souls (November 2) along with the prayer of the Our Father and the Creed for the poor souls in purgatory are just a few examples. There are many others. As we pray for the deceased, lets especially remember or parents and other family members who have gone before us into eternal life.

From Zion United Methodist Soup Kitchen:

One of Zion United Methodist Church's food ministries is our Thursday night soup kitchen. Different churches take a week of the month to help cook, serve, and clean up. Currently, the meal is being offered at First United Methodist Church until our kitchen is ready.

On the third Thursday of each month, a group of two churches and one bank rotate to help at the soup kitchen. Each of the 3 groups have been volunteering 4 times a year. One of the churches has had to drop out of the rotation. We are looking for another church or other organization who would like to fill this vacancy.

I plan the meal and buy the food, but the volunteers provide dessert. We generally serve 25-38 people. Each church or organization would need to provide 2-4 helpers. Some groups have teams that take turns. I arrive at First Methodist at 4pm, we serve food at 6pm, and are done with clean-up by 7pm.
