

This week, we reflect on the Holy Family. Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. I suspect Joseph is the most difficult for us. In the scriptures, he doesn't say a word. Not one! When he is in a scene, Mary or Jesus speak. But not a word from Joseph. So what does he think of all this? All we have is our imagination. So what follows is not from Scripture. Not a word. But these words are thoughtful or at least thought provoking. This passage is another from Max Lucado in his book *He Still Moves Stones*.

"This isn't the way I planned it, God. Not at all. My child being born in a stable? This isn't the way I thought it would be. A cave with sheep and donkeys, hay and straw? My wife giving birth with only the stars to hear her?

This isn't at all what I imagined. No, I imagined family. I imagined grandmothers. I imagined neighbors clustered outside the door and friends standing at my side. I imagined the house erupting with the first cry of the infant. Slaps on the back. Loud laughter. Jubilation.

That's how I thought it would be.

But now....Who will celebrate with us? The sheep? The shepherds? The stars?

This doesn't seem right. What kind of husband am I? I provide no midwife to aid my wife. No bed to rest her back. Her pillow is a blanket from my donkey....

Did I miss something? Did I, God?

When you sent an angel and spoke of the son being born----this isn't what I pictured. I envisioned Jerusalem, the temple, the priests, and the people gathered to watch. A pageant perhaps. A parade....I mean, this is the Messiah!

Or, if not born in Jerusalem, how about Nazareth? Wouldn't Nazareth have been better? At least there I have my house and my business. Out here, what do I have? A weary mule, a stack of firewood, and a pot of warm water. This is not the way I wanted it to be!...Forgive me for asking but....is this how God enters the world? The coming of the angel, I accepted. The questions people asked about the pregnancy, I can tolerate. The trip to Bethlehem, fine. But why a birth in a stable, God?

Any minute now Mary will give birth. Not to a child but to the Messiah. Not to an infant, but to God. That's what the angel said. That's what Mary believes. And God, my God, that's what I want to believe. But surely you can understand. It's not easy. It seems so....so....bizarre.

I am unaccustomed to strangeness, God. I am a carpenter. I make things fit. I square off the edges. I follow the plumb line. I measure twice before I cut once. Surprises are not the friend of the builder. I like to know the plan before I begin.

But this time I am not the builder, am I? This time I am the tool. A hammer in your grip. A chisel in your hands. This project is yours, not mine.

I guess it is foolish of me to question you. Forgive my struggling. Trust doesn't come easily to me, God. But you never said it would be easy, did you?

One final thing, Father. The angel you sent? Any chance you could send another? If not an angel, maybe a person? I don't know anyone around here and some company would be nice. Maybe an innkeeper or a traveler? Even a shepherd would do."

May you have a blessed Christmas!....and a good, prayerful time reflecting on the Holy Family, including St. Joseph!



Thank you to all who responded to our invitation to complete a Discovering Christ evaluation form. If you haven't done so, please check your email for the invite and complete the online form. It's not too late! Overwhelmingly, the responses were positive and indicated that DC participants were ready to move on to the next phase - FOL-LOWING CHRIST. Your feedback has provided the Evangelization Team very helpful suggestions for our future programming. You spoke, and we listened. Thank you, so much.

Following Christ will begin with a re-gathering session on Sunday, January 5, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. in Apostles Hall. Bring your calendars and we'll work on the schedule together. There are some specific scheduling circumstances to consider for some Sundays in January and February. Bring your thoughts, notes, and questions from DC, as we would like to take a small step back in reflection of our DC experience in order that we be propelled into a fruitful beginning of Following Christ, the first session of which will be the very next Sunday, January 12.

As we await our gathering on January 5, we ask your prayerful consideration regarding how you perhaps are being called to help the Evangelization Team and ensure that the ChristLife program continues in our parish. Having experienced DC, you most likely have gotten a feel for the varying aspects of the program such as hospitality, prayer and worship, small group facilitation, preparing the environment and clean-up, registration, A/V skills, marketing and promotion, and more. We will be reviewing the areas of service needed at the gathering and will provide orientation to those who are new to any of these tasks.

In DC, we became accustomed to sharing a full meal together. This will change with the Following Christ phase as it will include only light hospitality snacks and drinks. Please plan your evening meal accordingly.

There will not be a formal registration form since Following Christ is simply an extension of the registration you completed for Discovering Christ. Participants of Following Christ will only be those who have previously journeyed through DC. HOWEVER, we will need confirmation of your participation in order that we can properly plan and be prepared. Also, please let us know if you will need child care. You can confirm participation by calling the parish office or emailing tmckay@ssppcatholic.com.

We are very excited to begin this next phase with all of you! May God bless you all. Enjoy this final Advent week of preparation for the coming of our Savior. Have a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!
