

December 8th is this Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent. Because of this, the Feast Day of our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, is transferred to Monday. The Vatican has stated that it is a holy day of obligation for us. This means, of course, that it is a day on which we will come to church to publicly proclaim our faith in God and thank Him for the gift of his mother. By her immaculate conception, she was prepared to be a worthy vessel for Jesus our Savior.

We have celebrated Mary's Immaculate Conception for many years, yet we still find people who insist that it is not true. They deny the immaculate conception of Mary as, at best, meaning Mary would then have no need of Jesus as her savior or, at worst, as our attempting to raise Mary to the level of a goddess.

First, Mary most emphatically is NOT a goddess. Never was, never will be. She was, is, and always will be a human as you and I are. She needed Jesus as her savior. Indeed He IS her savior. At the same time, it is an absolute truth of our faith that she was immaculately conceived and preserved from all sin.

So, how can this be? There are two ways of saving a person. For example, if I cannot swim and I fall into a deep pool. I desperately need someone to rescue me or I am doomed. Likewise, if I were standing by the edge of the deep pool, lost my balance, and was starting to fall in, I also would need a savior. If someone were to grab me before I fell in, he or she would be my savior even though I never fell in. I never even got wet! Our Savior, Jesus Christ, is the one who pulls us out of the pool of sin and death. Mary, his mother, is the one whom Jesus rescued before she ever fell into the pool of sin.

Some object this is impossible because Mary, the Mother of God, was obviously born before He was. However, Jesus is not just fully a man, but He is also fully God. Time is not an issue for God. The following is from some notes from my seminary days. I do not know the author, but whoever he or she was said, "I am the Mother of God, who is my Son. Therefore, I am his daughter. although his mother. He was born from eternity and is my Son. I was born within time, and vet I am his mother. He is my creator and is my Son. So I am his creation and his mother, for He is God. It was and is a divine marvel that my Son is part of the Trinity, alive always, who has taken me as his mother. What a wonder! I received my existence from Jesus as God and Jesus received his existence as man and savior from his mother. If then, the Son received his human existence from his mother, we must either say that the Son was stained by the Mother or we must say that the Mother was immaculate. This makes sense to me. How about you?

Mary was proclaimed by an angel as "full of grace." Mary responded with faith, saying, "May it be done unto me according to your word." Mary, in submission to God's plan, is a role model for us. She, who went to Jesus to ask for his help for the bride and groom at the wedding feast of Cana, is our helper as she prays for us. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Amen.
