

A week ago, it was the last day of Christmas. Just as the shepherds returned to their flocks and the Magi returned to their homes, we too had to "leave the stable" and return to our lives. This is what we call ordinary time. Like us. Jesus lived a fairly ordinary childhood and adolescence. In fact, it seems so ordinary that the Bible says nothing about it except for the incident at the temple in Jerusalem when he was 12 years old. Scholars often refer to these years as the hidden life of our Lord. But now things are changing rapidly for Jesus. And for Mary. At some point Joseph had died. Jesus never married, which is very unusual for his society. He must have continued working as a carpenter to support himself and his widowed mother. But now at 30 years of age, he has left home, was baptized by his cousin John, spent time in the desert, and has gathered his first disciples.

Back at home, Mary has been adjusting to changes as well. First, her husband died, and now her son has left home. Unlike today, when we can quickly visit over long distances thanks to modern transportation or at least are just a phone call away, Mary must have had little contact with her beloved son. The Bible makes no mention of her at the river Jordan for Jesus' baptism. Immediately following that, Jesus went into the desert for 40 days and nights. It is doubtful that Mary had any idea where he was. Was she lonely without her son after all these years? Surely the house must have seemed empty and quiet. Now she has received an invitation to a wedding! As she traveled the road, did she know her son would be there as well? Probably not. But she must have wondered...and hoped! And he was! How she must have reioiced. But then a problem developed...

The wedding feast at Cana, following the custom of the time, must have lasted for several days. Food and wine in great quantities would have been consumed as songs and toasts, probably similar to those found in the Song of Solomon, were made to the new couple. Then, at this high point of the celebration, they ran out of wine. A huge embarrassment for the wedding family. What a social faux it must have been! Quietly and without drawing any attention, a very concerned and compassionate Mary steps in. She hurries to her son. "They have no wine!" she announces to him. Our Lord's response may seem harsh to our ears. "O woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Here the problem of translation rears its head. The literal phrase, "what to me and to you" is a Semitic formula that lacks any friendly tone found in English. Some scholars have suggested, "Dear woman, what is that to you and me?" as a more accurate way to express in our language the exchange between Jesus and Mary.

Now comes the part I really love. What all this comes down to is, Jesus has said it is not yet his time. Jesus knows that if he intervenes, everything will change. But this is mom asking. And his mother trusts him completely. Even though it is not his time, this is his mother asking for him to do something, anything to help. "Do whatever he tells you," she instructs the servants. They must have wondered what was going on. Their confusion deepens as Jesus acts. "Fill these jugs with water, and then take some to the head waiter," he instructs. Can you hear their thoughts? Water! Why? What they need is wine, not water! But they obey. And Jesus, for the sake of his mother and the young couple, changes both time and water. It was not his time, but he changes time. At his mother's request to do something, he changes it to his time as he miraculously changes also the water into wine.

This wedding at Cana is a tremendous example not only of our Lord's compassion and power, but also of a mother's intercession. We often pray to Jesus for our families and friends. This is a good thing. Keep it up. But I often wonder. Since it wasn't his time, if anyone other than Mary had approached him with this request, what would Jesus have done? We will never know. But we do know what he did for his mother. So we too, in addition to our prayers to Jesus, also address prayers to Mary, asking her to pray to her Son for us.
