The Diocese of Grand Rapids Office of Communications issues the following statement from Most Reverend David J. Walkowiak, bishop of Grand Rapids, congratulating Bishop Edward Weisenburger on his appointment as archbishop of Detroit.

This morning brings news of great joy to our Province that our Holy Father has appointed Most Reverend Edward Weisenburger, bishop of Tucson, as the new archbishop of Detroit! Bishop Weisenburger is a man of great Eucharistic faith. He has spoken passionately in defense of our migrant brothers and sisters and care for creation. His heart for these priorities will be a great blessing as he begins his episcopal ministry in the Archdiocese.



*Entry Fee will be collected on the day of the event. Registering in advance is not required, but would be helpful. We need to have a total number of players that is divisible by four (16, 20, 24). Contact Toni at the parish office to register.

Games are played in tables of four, broken down into two teams of two. Each player draws a number. Players will rotate from table to table with each game. Player table assignments, by game, are randomly pre-set by player number.

Games will consist of eight hands with each person dealing twice at a table. If a team is set (Euchred), each player on that team must deposit \$.25 into the cup at their current table. Individual scores and number of sets (euchres) are recorded at the end of the eight hands of the current game.

Additional game rules provided on the day of the event.

All entry fees collected will be distributed to the individuals with the top three overall scores. Payout: $1^{st} - 60\%$; $2^{nd} - 30\%$; 3^{rd} - 10%. The quarters collected in the 'euchred' cups from all tables will be awarded to the person with the highest number of sets.
