

Dear Friends in Christ.

For 50 years, the CRS Rice Bowl program has been helping our brothers and sisters struggling with hunger. The program began with humble roots in Allentown, Pennsylvania, where Catholics organized ecumenical efforts to help families facing famine in Africa. Today, millions of people still face life-threatening levels of hunger, food insecurity, and malnutrition, and the small cardboard box remains a sign of hope for them.

"During the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind" (Spes non confundit, 10). This is the time for us to recommit to our global family. It also provided assistance for those in need through the new St. Vincent de Paul Conference at St. Patrick Parish in Portland. Thank you for your generosity in supporting these local efforts!
