Prayer is something that we acknowledge is very important. Yet, far too often, we relegate it to the bottom of our list rather than the top. We know we should pray to God every day. But do we? We should pray to God because we love him. But again, love is not something that is simply taught. Love of God isn't something we learned from someone else. Nor did we learn how to rejoice in God's light, or how to desire to live, or how to love our parents. When we were first born, we didn't just immediately love our parents. It took time. We were born with reason planted inside us, like a seed containing the ability and the need to love. It took time to grow. We experienced our parents' love for us. We experienced their giving us clothing, food, shelter, hugs. and love. So it is with God's love for us.

We are born with this desire for love within us. Not just love of parents, but also love for God. We have within us from God the ability to fulfill his commands. We have no reason to resent them, as if it was more than we could pay back from what we have received. When we use our God given ability correctly, we lead a life of holiness and virtue. If we don't, then we fall into sin. Sin, then, is the misuse of powers given to us by God to do good.

Because God gave us this ability to do good, we can say the same thing about love. We have within us the ability to love God. Each one of us can learn this. Look at this planet. It is a wonderful place to be born, and it is natural to desire things that are good and pleasing to the eye. A sunny day, warm air, clean water, beautiful plants, and the ability to make sounds that are musical and pleasing are but a few of the many gifts God gives to us. Other gifts come from God as well, such as the ability to build things, to sell items, and to create wealth.

Somehow, all these gifts from God have escaped us. We took them for granted. Even worse, we began to battle with others to hoard more and more items for ourselves. Finally, God our loving Father sent his Son, Jesus Christ, into the world. He came to reveal God's love for us and to show us how to live.

This is what our faith is all about. It reveals his love and the creation of the world. We learn how to love God. Having loved him and followed Jesus in this life, we are then welcomed into eternal life. This is our only way into eternal life. To reject Jesus and his teaching is to reject God and, therefore, eternal life with him in heaven.

Do you want to live longer? Do you want more than the decades of life here on earth? Do you wish to live forever? Then we must embrace Jesus. To love Jesus means we follow his teachings, obey his commandments, and learn to love him as he has and continues to love us. Learning to love Jesus means we pray. But what is prayer? How do we pray?

St. John Damascene taught, "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." St. Therese of Lisieux said, "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven; it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and iov."

"Teach us to pray!" the disciples of Jesus asked. And He taught them how to pray. Learning to pray will be our topic in the coming weeks. It is important. It is the desire of our hearts.
